PITTSBURGH — The Christian Leaders Fellowship, an ecumenical group of local bishops and denominational executives, will lead a prayer service at the annual dedication of the Pittsburgh Crèche, Friday, Nov. 16 at noon in the plaza at US Steel Towers on Grant Street, downtown. Archbishop William C. Skurla, head of the Byzantine Catholic Archeparchy of Pittsburgh, will participate. Other participating faith community leaders include:
