DIRECTIONS

DIRECTIONS TO ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST CATHEDRAL

FROM THE WEST:

1. Proceed on **Route 376** (Direction of Monroeville) to the **Squirrel Hill/Homestead Exit** (immediately before Squirrel Hill Tunnels).
2. Follow signs in the direction of **Homestead**.... you will cross the Monongahela River....continue to the top of the hill (cemetery in front of you).
3. At the end of this road, turn **right** onto **West Run Rd**....proceed about 1 mile.
4. **St. John Cathedral** will be on the right.

FROM THE EAST:

Follow **Route 22** to **Route 376 West**
(Direction of Pittsburgh)

Proceed through the Squirrel Hill Tunnels and immediately after the tunnels, take the **Squirrel Hill/Homestead Exit**

Follow directions from #2 above.....

FROM THE SOUTH:

Follow **Route 79 North** to Pittsburgh

Follow signs for **Route 376 East** (Direction of Monroeville)

Follow directions from #2 above

FROM THE NORTH:

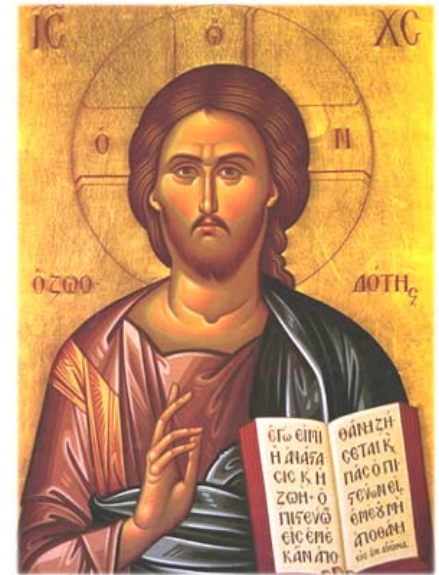
Follow **Rt 79 South** to **Rt 279 South**

Fr. Jason Charron was ordained in 2008 and served parishes in North Carolina and rural Ontario. He was also Chaplain at Sacred Heart High School in Walkerton, ON.
